POLICE REPORTS BY WATCH AREA

College Park Watch Area:

LOUD NOISE/MUSIC

As the weather becomes warmer, the police department wants to remind the citizens of Addison to be considerate of your fellow neighbors in regards to noise and music. There are Village Ordinances and State Laws that cover loud noise and music regardless of the time, day or night.

- **Noise Violations** - Village Ordinance 13-7.2: It shall be unlawful for person(s) to create or maintain loud or raucous noises in an unreasonable manner so as to alarm or disturb another.
- **Disorderly Conduct** - Village Ordinance 13-7.1(A)(8): Any person who creates or maintains loud or raucous noises in an unreasonable manner so as to alarm or disturb another.
- **Vehicles Making Loud or Unnecessary Noises** - Village Ordinance 11-56: It shall be unlawful to operate a motor vehicle on the streets or highways within the corporate limits of the Village which makes an unusually loud or unnecessary noise.
- **Sound Amplification Systems** - IL Crim. Code 5/12-611: No driver/owner of any motor vehicle within this state shall operate or permit operation of any sound amplification system which can be heard outside the vehicle from 75 or more feet.
